REFLECTION

The fourth Sunday of Easter is known as Good Shepherd Sunday – and it is also the day we celebrate Mother's Day. Mother's Day in Australia falls on Sunday, May 8, 2022. It's traditionally celebrated on the second Sunday in May and was first celebrated in Australia in 1910, according to the National Library of Australia.



No matter how old you are, there's always one person who

will always love and care for you unconditionally. Reminding your mother how much she means to you is something anyone of any age can do, whether you're celebrating together or apart.

Today we thank our mothers, pray for them, and honour them by celebrating Mother's Day, offering our mothers on the holy altar of God.

The role of mothers in our lives is very important. This is a day to admit gratefully the fact that none of us is able to return, in the same measure, all the love that our mothers have given us. Their influence on their children is so great that it affects the children throughout their lives. Our mothers not only gave birth to us, but they nursed us, nurtured us, trained us in their religious beliefs and practices, taught us good manners and ideal behaviour, disciplined us as best as they could, and made us good citizens of our country, our Church, and our society.

As Christians we acknowledge that we have two mothers. On Mother's Day, let us celebrate the love that is bestowed on us by our earthly mother and our Heavenly Mother, the Mother of Jesus. The Catholic Church proclaims the great nobility of the Mother of Jesus, Mary most holy, and presents her as the supreme model for all mothers.

Today, and always, let us show our love and appreciation for both our mothers and let us ask our Heavenly Mother to take care of our earthly mothers. We, as children, need to continually express our love for our mothers by sacrificing our time, talents, and lives for them, and for those of us whose mothers are no longer with them, we should remember them in our prayers.

Today I wish all mothers a Happy Mother's Day and my prayer is:

Loving God, we thank you for the love of the mothers you have given us, whose love is so precious it can never be measured, whose patience seems to have no end. May we see your loving hand behind them and guiding them. We pray for those mothers who fear they will run out of love or time or patience. We ask you to bless them with your own special love. We ask this in the name of Jesus. Amen


