IS IT TIME?

Following Father Geo's words on the front page of the Newsletter last week and during this forthcoming time of Lent, perhaps you have considered that it might be time for you to join one or more of our parish mass ministries or groups. We ask you to consider listening to the promptings of the Holy Spirit during the next few weeks as we bring together the various ministries for you to bring true meaning of "bring the message of Jesus Christ to all."

Mass Co-ordinator (Setup)

As a family in Christ by rite of our Baptism we come together to share a meal. I enjoy preparing this "meal" by preparation of the elements necessary to make our mass/liturgy together an enjoyable event, by setting up the altar for Mass.

Extra-ordinary Minister of Communion

It is a privilege to be able, with those around me to share Jesus as true body, blood, soul and divinity within the sacrament of Holy Communion. We all come together to be one with Christ and each other. A person in this role is called an Extra-ordinary Minister of Communion because priests and deacons are 'Ordinary' Ministers of Communion and the priest is the only 'Minister of the Eucharist'.

Leader

As leader, it is my responsibility to formally welcome the gathered congregation prior to the start of Mass and lead the intercessions in the Prayers of the Faithful. It is also my responsibility to ensure that all ministers are present.

<u>Reader</u>

Reader/Minister of the Word proclaim the reading at Mass. In preparation to proclaim the readings at Mass, I am required to prepare by using the book Break Open the Word. This book provides the exact copy of the Sunday readings in the Lectionary.

<u>Data</u>

The Data Projector Operator ministry involves running the Data Projector Computer at Sunday Masses. This includes running the PowerPoint which contains the hymns and responses.

Altar Server

Altar Servers have a very important part to play, since they are helping the priest on the sanctuary the whole time during Mass. Children, teenagers who have undertaken their First Communion are invited to become Altar Servers.

Music

Being part of the music ministry is a wonderful opportunity to help lead the church in worshiping God together through the mass. There is nothing more beautiful then hearing the whole church singing together as one.

Open and Close the Church

This ministry enables the church to be open and welcoming for parishioners and visitors.


