ear Parish Family and Friends,

As stated in our vision statement, our Parish community is a dynamic, growing church committed to impacting the lives of many by spreading the message of Christ to all. Parish ministries play a key role in achieving the vision of our church. I express my heartfelt gratitude to everyone who is part of different ministries for your tireless contribution toward the progress of our church.

As informed earlier, we will have our ministry call-up on March 17th. Over the past few weeks, we have seen the role of different ministries and the importance of responding to God's call to fulfill our spiritual responsibilities and participating in the mission of Jesus to spread the Gospel to the end of the world. As Christians, we are called not only to experience the transformative power of Christ in our own lives but also to be bearers of the Good News to those around us.

Though we are many, as a church we are one body in Christ, and we do not have the same function (Rom 12:4-5 & 1 Cor 12: 12), but each one of us is differently gifted (1 Cor 12). We may be blessed with the abilities of serving, giving, ministering, leading, teaching, or communicating (1 Cor.12, Rom 12, 6-8). As the unique function of each organ in our body, in coordination with others is important, each one in coordination with others must contribute our unique skills toward the growth of our parish. However, each parish member is important irrespective of your gifts and each one of you is equally honored without any division.

The call to discipleship and ministry is not exclusive to the twelve apostles but is open to all of us. We are faithful stewards of God (1 Pet 4:10) and I encourage each one of you to share Jesus's love in actions and truth (1 John 3:18). Jesus is the vine and as branches, we must remain in Him to get support and nourishment to bear fruits (John 15: 1-5). Parish ministry unites us with Christ while fostering our faith and spiritual discipline. It also gives us opportunities for fellowship and community service, while creating a long-term impact on the spiritual growth of the generations that come after us.

These past weeks have been a time to discern how you are called up to minister in our parish. Some of you who have discerned your gift or skill have already committed to serving in a particular ministry. No doubt a few of you with discernment may be doubtful of your capabilities or challenges that you may face with ministry commitment. When Jesus said "Come", with incredible faith and courage, Peter came out of the boat in the middle of the storm and walked on the water (Mat 14:29). Similarly, we need to respond to His call towards the ministries of the church with courage as He is always with us to help overcome any challenges we may encounter. Though none of us is equipped to meet every need of the parish, we must use this opportunity to meet some of the needs for which we are equipped. Every little thing we do for others has great power. Peter said while healing the lame: "I will give you what I have" (Act 3:6). Similarly, you must introspect on 'What do I have that I could extend to our Parish ministry'? and 'How has He uniquely gifted me and called me'?

I pray that God will guide you during the coming week to discern your unique skill and commit to the right Parish Ministry at the upcoming Ministry Call-up on March 17th, so that you can be a part of building God's Kingdom as instruments in His hands. All new volunteers will be provided with the necessary guidance and support by the ministry team.

WHY WE DO THE THINGS WE DO

SCRUTINIES: On the 3rd, 4th & 5th Sunday's of Lent, those preparing for initiation in the church at Easter will celebrate the scrutinies during Mass. They are part of a series of rites belonging to the RCIA (Rite of Christian Inhiation of Adults).

During the scrutiny we call on God's healing presence to free the catechumens from the forces of darkness and to open them more fully to the goodness and fullness of life promised us by Christ. For those who are making their final preparation for baptism, Lent is a time of purification and enlightenment. In the light of \god's word, they examine their lives and ask the entire Christian community to pray that whatever is weak and sinful within them may be eliminated and that whatever is good and holy may be affirmed.

During this time the readings of **Year A** are used because these scriptures are of major importance in regard to Christian initiation.
