Dear Friends and Parish Families,

"Jesus is Lord, He is risen!"

When the bird was consumed by the flames, a new phoenix sprang forth from the ashes. Thus, the phoenix symbolizes immortality, resurrection and life after death. It sums up the Easter message perfectly.

Jesus gave up His life and from the grave He was raised to Life again on the third day. New life rises from the ashes of death. Today, we are celebrating Christ's victory over the grave, the gift of eternal life for all who believe in Jesus.

I thank God for the hope that each one of us experiences through His resurrection. The Church's greatest celebration os the year, held on the eve of Easter Sunday, marks the victory of Christ over sin and death and our sharing in the lift of God. In the early Church it was at this celebration that 'newcomers' were baptised. Although today a person may be baptised a Catholic other times of the year, the newcomer's decision to reject sin and embrace the new life of Christ makes Easter a highly appropriate time for baptism. Since the Easter vigil is the climax of the year for the parish community, it is fitting that it also be the climax of the newcomer's journey of faith into the Catholic community.
